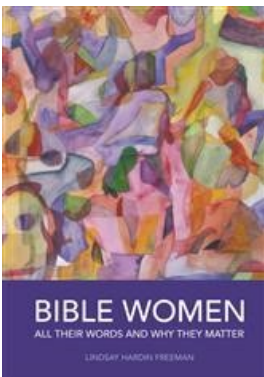

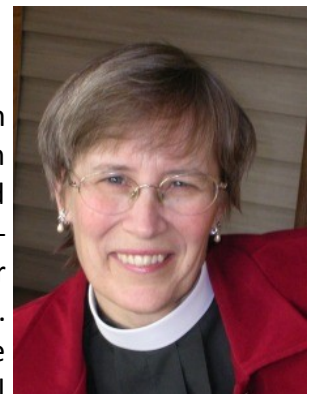


About the Book
